Pastor's Corner–

Song for the week: Do Not Fear to Hope, by Rory Cooney There is a beautiful video, sung by Theresa Donohoo, with lyrics for this week's song. If you watch the news, talk to friends, speak with medical professionals, it seems harder and harder to hold onto hope. The other day I was feeling really down—nonstop spread of COVID, people refusing to be vaccinated and care for their neighbor, tens of thousands fleeing Afghanistan, a forgotten civil war in Syria, destruction and death due to climate change, the continued violence and death on our streets in Kansas City, the addict who still has not hit rock bottom and won't seek help, all these man-made. I suppose the list is endless. But what I failed to do was to see the response of people to all these situations. Nations taking in refugees, agencies mobilizing to respond to refugees and climate crisis, police risking their lives to keep us safe, doctors and nurses working tirelessly to save those who have succumbed to COVID, the generosity of people donating supplies and money to alleviate suffering. It's a long "race." It's so easy to destroy and tear down, but long hard work to build and create. "The race shall not be to the swift, the fight not to the strong." Let the tears flow and pray to God for strength and hope and continue to respond in love. The Resurrection is the final Word.

The event this year however, will be held virtually with runners encouraged to submit their 5K times to the race directors. Race registration is
