Clemency for KJ - Kevin "KJ" Johnson, a Black youth, was sentenced to death for the killing of a white Kirkwood police officer, William McEntee, a crime committed when he was 19 years old. Despite many erroneous and unfair court rulings, grossly ineffective counsel, and racist prosecutorial policies, KJ remains on Missouri's death row. On May 11th, 2022, the Missouri Attorney General motioned the Missouri Supreme Court for an execution date. We need your support to uplift Kevin, his family, and his community. Please help by today by signing the clemency petition.

Sponsor needed - Many of our parishioners have had the opportunity to interact with and support our family from Nigeria. And they are most grateful for everything! We have recently learned of another Nigerian family in need of sponsors. They are a mother, father and son (10 or 11). They are currently in a detention center in central California where temperatures are averaging over 100. What is needed initially is a place for them to stay until a more long-term home is found, support to access food, stores, finding a lawyer, etc. The SFX RIM Committee has resources and knowledge which they are happy to share in all these areas.
